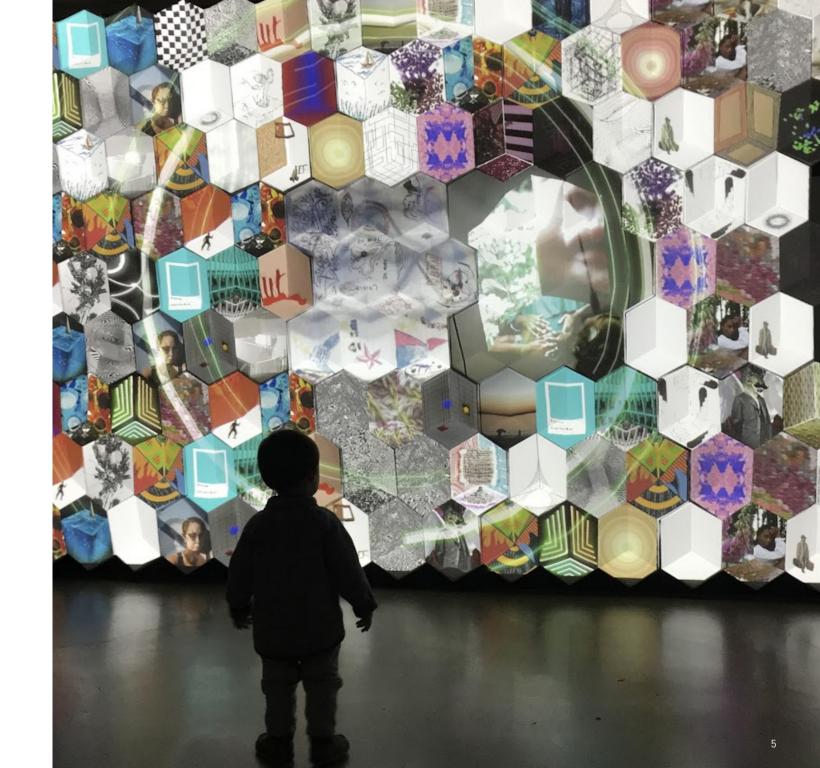
Strong communities create unique art.

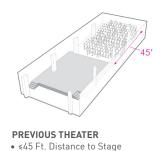
CASE STUDIES

From productions featuring a woman in the title role in *Hamlet*, inter-racial couples in *Pride and Prejudice*, or gender-bending character portrayals in *Titus Andronicus*, Cincinnati Shakespeare Company (CSC) is stretching and growing within their new home and reaching new audiences.

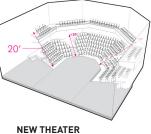
CSC's new home broadens the boundaries of their creative expression through:

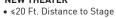
- 1. Staging possibilities: Addition of a thrust stage, catwalk, and fly loft
- **2. Enhanced performer-patron connection:** All patrons less than 6 rows or 20 feet from the action
- **3. Revenue and community building:** from disco nights and corporate event rentals to hosting COVID-19 testing clinics and blood drives.

• 35 Ft. Ceiling Height over Stage



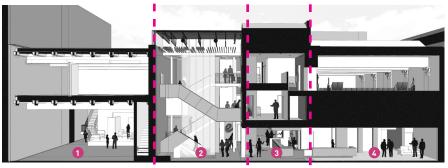




Ensemble Theatre Cincinnati A LIVING ROOM FOR AN ECLECTIC NEIGHBORHOOD

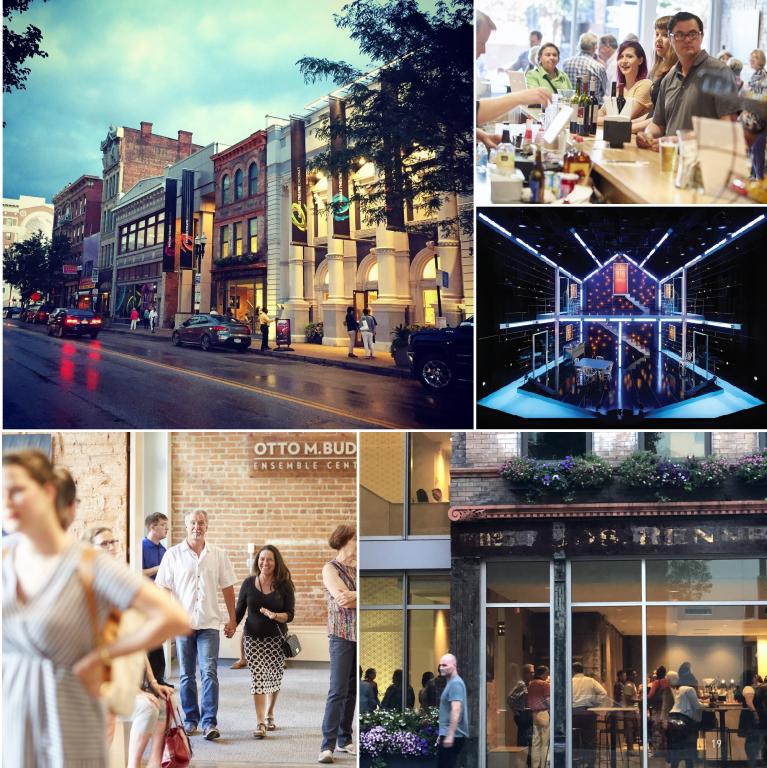
Ensemble Theatre Cincinnati (ETC) audiences seek to be surprised—even shocked— by new perspectives into issues they thought they knew. Renovating ETC's four buildings to function as one space has made them a more visible, welcoming presence on the block they've occupied for 30 years.

The renovation has increased the number of shows they can produce and allowed their staff to work more collaboratively. The new ETC has more social space for people to relax with a drink before a show, discuss what they've seen on stage, host a birthday party, or attend a networking happy hour.

Contemporary Craft CREATIVE FREEDOM TO ENVISION THEIR FUTURE

Contemporary Craft had built a strong community of artisans and makers when they went looking for their forever home. After working in rented space for 33 years, they found a new home in an existing building—one that could be repurposed by amplifying their appreciation for found objects, humble raw materials, and the art of craftsmanship.

The new Contemporary Craft in Lawrenceville, a transitioning neighborhood in Pittsburgh, provides the space to make great art and share that work (and the process of making it) with the community. For Contemporary Craft, owning and creating their new space also unleashed newfound creative freedom to envision their future and use art, craft, and design to realize it.









Margaret & Michael Valentine Center for Dance MORE THAN A DANCE COMPANY: A COMMUNITY CATALYST

Cincinnati Ballet seeks to break down the stereotype that dance is only for a certain group of people. Their diverse dance company, academy, and programs like Ballet Moves (safely supporting dance opportunities for people with mobility challenges) make them more than a dance company—they're a community catalyst.

The Margaret & Michael Valentine Center for Dance dramatically marks the gateway to Cincinnati's Eden Park arts district. Windows in every studio frame unique views while simultaneously letting passersby see people of all shapes, sizes, color, and abilities experience the joy of dance.

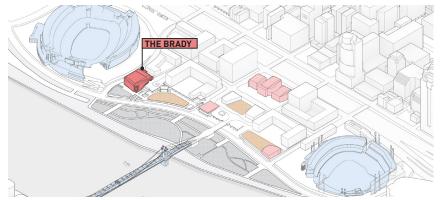

The Andrew J Brady Music Center **"ONE OF THE FINEST SOUNDING ROOMS ON EARTH..."**

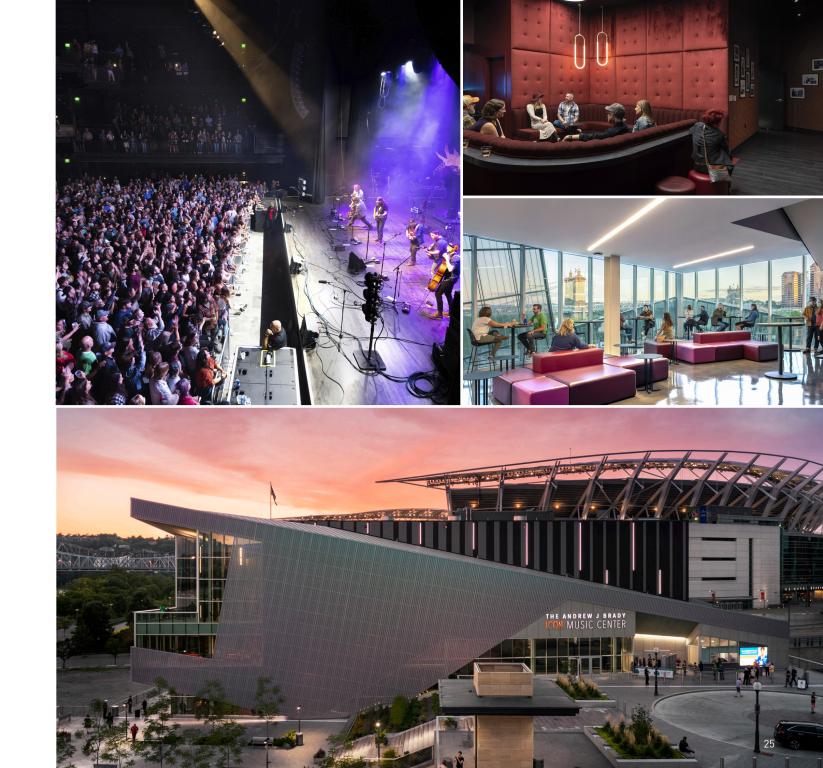

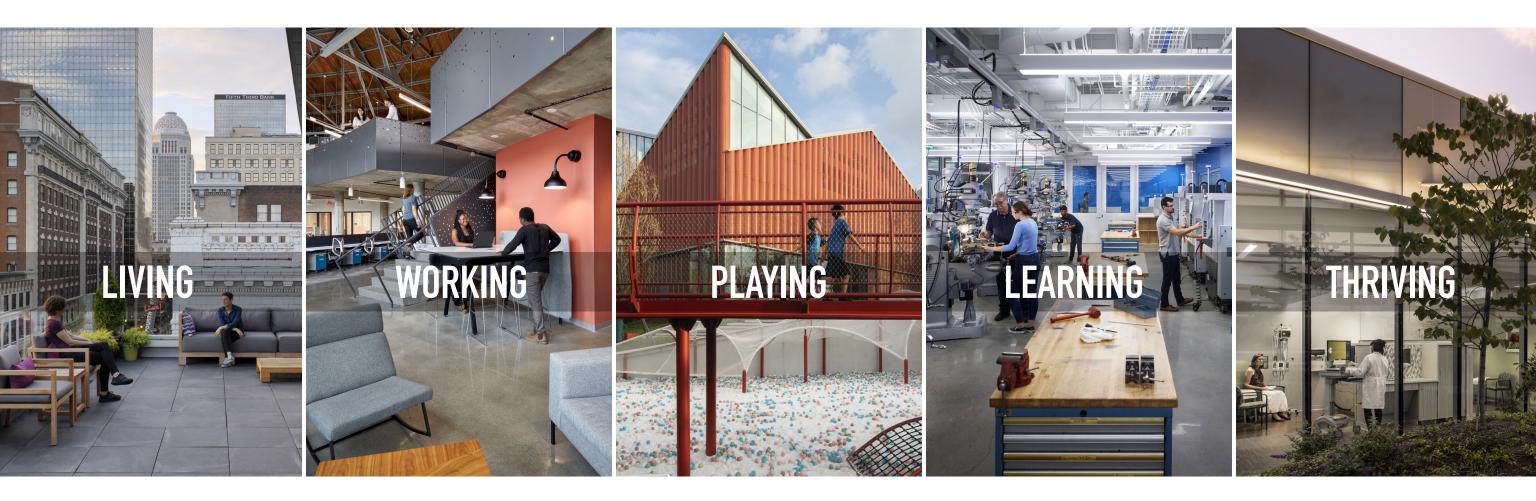




The Brady completes the Cincinnati riverfront symmetry of landmark riverfront institutions.
